



38 bins would be placed in the hallways; and that the cafeteria bins could be more  
39 organized by color coding. They discussed where the \$5,000 from the grant  
40 would be spent.

41 Mr. Drew moved to accept the grant of \$5,000, Mr. Carvell seconded. Motion  
42 passed 5-0.

43 5. New Business:  
44 a. Budget Work Session

45 Mr. Dargie moved to have the superintendent look at the present budget and find  
46 savings that could be implemented to increase the fund balance estimation for  
47 this year from the current \$200,000 estimate to an estimate of \$400,000. Mr.  
48 Drew seconded.

49  
50 Mr. Dargie explained that the purpose of this request is to try to find a way to  
51 lower the estimated tax rate increase that is currently forecasted at 10.3%. If  
52 there were no other budget changes, then this change would lower the  
53 forecasted increase to 9.5%.

54  
55 Mr. Rick Wood encouraged the board to spend money this year to help lower the  
56 spending required for the next fiscal year. Mr. Dargie noted that spending money  
57 this year instead of next year does not change the tax rate implications of the  
58 spending; and that savings only occur when money is not spent in either period.

59  
60 Mr. Carvell noted that he was not comfortable with finalizing the reduction for this  
61 year without further information. Mr. Dargie confirmed that the motion was a  
62 request for the administration to come back with a list of actions only, and it was  
63 not a final determination of the reduction.

64  
65 The motion passed 5-0.

66  
67 Mr. Dargie stated that he felt that estimated tax increase of 9.5% was too high  
68 and that the proposed budget needed to be reduced. He stated that he was  
69 comfortable with a \$275,000 reduction, but that reduction too low and did not  
70 provide enough tax relief. He then moved that the board direct the  
71 superintendent to come back at the next meeting with a prioritized list of cuts to  
72 the budget that totaled \$475,000. Mr. Drew seconded.

73  
74 There was discussion about the level of the potential cuts. The merits of various  
75 levels were reviewed by the board, with discussions about cuts totaling  
76 \$475,000, \$700,000, \$900,000, or \$1,000,000. The corresponding tax increases  
77 for these levels of cuts are 7.7%, 6.8%, 6.1%, and 5.7%, respectively.

78

79 Mr. Carvell moved that the dollar value of the pending motion be amended from  
80 \$475,000 to \$1,000,000. Mr. Willette seconded. The motion to amend passed 3-  
81 2, with Mr. Dargie and Mr. Drew in opposition.

82  
83 The main motion then passed 4-1, with Mr. Drew in opposition. The motion as  
84 amended was that the board directs the superintendent to come back at the next  
85 meeting with a prioritized list of cuts to the proposed budget that totaled  
86 \$1,000,000.

87 b. Policy Proposals:

88 Policy Number 2329 – Donations. First reading of modification to policy number  
89 2329 to include references to crowd source funding. Mr. Willette moved and Mr.  
90 Dargie seconded to approve the first reading. Motion passed 5-0.

91 Policy Number 2422 – Public Complaints About School Personnel, Employees,  
92 Students or Administrators. This is a new policy that basically requires that  
93 complaints about personnel originate at the lowest level possible and then move  
94 to higher levels as appropriate. It was decided to postpone the first reading of  
95 policy number 2422 until the superintendent includes wording about the  
96 procedural steps to be taken.

97 Policy Number 3575 – Public Complaints Involving Non-Personnel Matters. This  
98 is a new policy that basically requires that complaints on non-personnel matters  
99 originate at the lowest level possible. Mr. Willette moved and Mr. Dargie  
100 seconded to approve the first reading. Motion passed 5-0.

101 Policy Number 5005 – Suspension and Expulsion of Students. This is a  
102 modification to an existing policy to clarify the handling of suspensions of more  
103 than 20 days, but less than a complete expulsion. Mr. Willette moved and Mr.  
104 Dargie seconded to approve the first reading. Motion passed 5-0. The  
105 Superintendent will make a minor spelling correction for the second reading.

106 Policy Number 5115 - Non-Educational Questionnaires, Surveys, and Research.  
107 This is a new policy that requires that there be 10 days advance notice for  
108 parents before surveys are administered to students regarding controversial  
109 topics. The survey or questionnaire has to be available online in advance. Mr.  
110 Willette moved and Mr. Dargie seconded to approve the first reading. Motion  
111 passed 5-0.

112 Policy Number 5120 – Photography and Audio or Audio-Visual Recording in  
113 School Classrooms. This is a new policy that requires approval in advance by all  
114 parties involved in recordings in school classrooms. Mr. Willette moved and Mr.  
115 Dargie seconded to approve the first reading. Motion failed 1-4, with Mr. Willette,  
116 Mr. Mannino, Mr. Drew, and Mr. Carvell in opposition.

117 6. Old Business:

118 There was no Old Business.

142 seconded. Motion passed 5-0.
